Dear Foreign Secretary,

We write to express our serious concerns regarding the conduct of Sri Lanka's Defence Attaché, Brigadier Priyanka Fernando.

On Sunday 4 February, Sri Lanka marked the 70th anniversary of independence from British rule. Members from the Tamil community observed the occasion by congregating peacefully outside the Sri Lankan High Commission in London, to protest the on-going persecution of Tamils on the island.

The Defence Attaché was filmed standing outside the High Commission, opposite the protestors, repeatedly running a finger across his throat – signalling the slitting of one's neck – in an obvious attempt to intimidate the Tamil people who were present¹. This is inappropriate, unacceptable and threatening behaviour, from someone who is serving in an official capacity as a guest of this country.

We urge you to make immediate representations to Sri Lanka's High Commissioner about this matter and we request that you withdraw Brigadier Priyanka Fernando's diplomatic papers and expel him.

Thank you for your consideration on this important issue.

We look forward to hearing from you at the earliest opportunity.
